

Message from Worshipful Master - Bill Enloe P. M.

Brethren,

The development of members should always begin with retention. It is important to know that if you do not have happy existing members it may not be possible to achieve gaining happy new members. So, what can we do to keep the current members happy?

Some may say that is a jaded question that might be difficult to answer. I may not be able to answer the question in a Trestle Board article, but I can say that the answer to making me happy starts with me. So, it may be safe to say that what makes our current members happy must come from the membership. The difficult part of keeping everyone happy is that we have over 100 individuals and those members may have 100 different independent things that will keep them happy. Should this mean that we not try to make the members happy?
