The Order of DeMolay in Arizona By William Enloe, PM

The Order of DeMolay is a Masonic Youth Organization for young men between the ages of 12 – 21. It is an organization that focuses around building strong citizens who love and respect God as well as their fellow citizen.

The Order of DeMolay accomplishes this by focusing on the 7 precepts of the organization:

- ♦ Filial Love Love of Parents,
- Reverence of Sacred things belief in a supreme being,
- ♦ Courtesy Consideration towards others,
- ◆ Comradeship loyalty to friends and loved ones,
- Fidelity Faithfulness to obligations, friends, and family,
- Cleanness Keeping one's mind and thought pure, and
- ◆ **Patriotism** love of country.

The organization started in 1919, by a Mason named Frank Sherman Land, who helped a young man in need of a father figure. This young man and 8 others formed a baseball team that would grow into an organization that would become The International Order of DeMolay.

Jacques DeMolay was the last Grand Master of the Knight Templar and was burned at the stake for not betraying his brothers and order. Frank Land and the 9 original members felt that he was the perfect martyr focus the teachings of this organization.
